This Italian version was translated from the original Spanish edition entitled *Historia de las cosas mas notables ritos y costumbres del gran dela China (The history of the remarkable rites and customs of great China)* by Father Gonzalez di Mendozza (1545-1618).

A Spanish missionary, Father Gonzalez di Mendozza wrote this travel book from the accounts of several groups of Augustinian and Franciscan missionaries who went to China in the 16th century. Aside from China, this book touches on the history and culture of the Philippines, Japan and Latin America, and contains one of the earliest descriptions of the Philippines and Southeast Asia. It is also the first book printed in Europe to contain Chinese characters and observations on the nature of Chinese writing and ideography.

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
